NOTICE OF RACE

1 ORGANISING AUTHORITY

The Organizing Authority (OA) will be the MT Partners in cooperation with Polish Yachting Association. Contact person:

2 VENUE

The venue will be the Lake Niegocin in Gizycko, Poland.

3 EVENT GRADING

The event has applied for ISAF Grade 3.

This grading is subject to review by the ISAF Match Race Ranking Sub Committee. The event may be re-graded when there is clear reason to do so.

4 PROGRAMME

4.1 Provisional Schedule:

- a. Race office opens on the 19.08.2010 at 12.00.
- b. Registration on the 19.08.2010 from 12.00 until 19.00.
- c. Crew weighing on the 19.08.2010 from 12.00 until 19.00.
- d. Practice will be on the 19.08.2010 from 12.30 until 19.00
Please register in advance for your time of practice. Time schedule will be made according to the time we receive your wishes via email.
- e. First briefing and meeting with the umpires on the 20.07.2010 at 09.00
- f. Racing days are from the 20.08.2010 to the 22.08.2010.
- g. Skipper meetings will be held on each racing day at 09.00.
- h. Time of the attention signal for the first race each racing day will be at 10.00.
- i. Daily press conference 30 minutes after the last race of each day.
- j. Prize giving on the 22.08.2010 after the final match (approximately at 16.30).

4.2 Unless excused by the OA, attendance at the following is mandatory:

- a. Initial briefing for skippers.
- b. Daily briefing for skippers.
- c. Daily press conferences, for skippers sailing that day.
- d. Prize giving for the final skippers and crews.

5 SKIPPERS ELIGIBILITY

- a. 12 skippers will be invited. Only skippers invited by the OA will be eligible to enter this event.
- b. The registered skipper shall helm the boat at all times while racing, except in an emergency.



- c. To remain eligible a skipper shall confirm acceptance of invitation in writing, (e-mail is acceptable) to be received by the date specified on the letter of invitation.
- d. All competitors shall meet the eligibility requirements of ISAF Regulation 19.2.
- e. All competitors shall obtain an ISAF Sailor ID by registering online at www.sailing.org/isafsailor. Skippers shall inform the OA of their ISAF Sailor ID at registration.

6 ENTRIES

- 6.1 The skipper shall be entered on completion of registration, crew weighing and the payment of all fees and deposits. All payments shall be made by local currency.
- 6.2 A non-returnable entry fee of 200 Euro shall accompany the acceptance of invitation, for this to be valid. Entry fee should be paid prior to June 20 2010 by bank transfer to OA bank account - unless excused by OA. Details will be provided in invitation.
- 6.3 Damage deposit
 - a. An initial damage deposit of 300 Euro shall be paid at registration, unless extended by the OA. This deposit is the maximum payable by the skipper as a result of any one incident.
 - b. In the event of a deduction from the damage deposit is decided by the OA it may require that the deposit be restored to its original amount before the skipper will be permitted to continue in the event.
 - c. Any remaining deposit after the event will be refunded after the event.

7 RULES

- 7.1 a. The event will be governed by the rules as defined in the RRS, including Appendix C.
 - b. The rules for the handling of boats will apply, and will also apply to any practice sailing and sponsor races. Class rules will not apply.
 - c. The national authority prescriptions will not apply.
- 7.2 Major alterations to the RRS
Add to RRS 41: (c) help to recover from the water and return on board a crew member, provided the return on board is at the approximate location of the recovery.
- 7.3 An International Jury (IJ) will be appointed, in accordance with RRS Appendix N.

8 BOATS AND SAILS

- a. The event will be sailed on Skippi650 type boats.
- b. 4 boats will be provided.
- c. The following sails will be provided for each boat: Mainsail, Jib, Spinnaker or Gennaker
- d. Boats will be allocated by draw, either daily or for each round as decided by the Race Committee.

9 CREW (INCLUDING SKIPPER)

- a. The number of crew (including the skipper) shall be 3 (max4 for women team). All registered crew shall sail all races.
- b. The maximum total crew weight, determined prior to racing shall be 262,5 kg when wearing at least shorts and shirts.

- c. When a registered skipper is unable to continue in the event OA may authorize an original crewmember to substitute.
- d. When a registered crewmember is unable to continue in the event OA may authorize a substitute, a temporary substitute or other adjustment.

10 EVENT FORMAT

- a. The event will consist of the following stages:
 - Stage 1 – A Single Round Robin
 - Stage 2 – Shortened Quarter Finals with 6 teams (Winner of Round Robin goes direct to Semi Final)
 - Stage 3 – Semi Final
 - Stage 4 – Petit Final
 - Stage 5 – Final
- b. The OA may change the format, terminate or eliminate any round, when conditions do not permit the completion of the intended format.

11 COURSE

- a. The course will be windward/leeward with starboard roundings, finishing downwind.
- b. The intended course area will be in front of the city beach.

12 ADVERTISING

- a. As boats and equipment will be supplied by the Organizing Authority, ISAF Regulation 20.4 applies. Each boat will be required to display advertising as supplied by the OA.
- b. Boats shall not be permitted the right to protest for breaches of any rules regarding advertising (amends RRS 60.1).

13 PRIZES

Trophies for first 3 teams. There will be no prize money

14 MEDIA, IMAGES AND SOUND

The OA may require television personnel and equipment (or dummies) to be carried on board while racing and may require competitors to be available for interviews. The OA shall have the right to use any images and sound recorded during the event free of any charge.

GIŻYCKO MATCH RACE

Polish Match Tour Act3

20-22 August 2010

Grade 2



CITY:

Giżycko is the largest town on the trail of the Great Mazurian Lakes. It is situated on a narrow pass between lakes Niegocin and Kisajno, in one of the most attractive regions of Poland, and perhaps Europe, as well.



Giżycko is truly part of “the land of a thousand lakes”, whose greatest attraction is nature. There are over 100 lakes around Giżycko. They surround it on all sides: Lake Niegocin in the south, Lake Mamry in the north, Lake Tajty in the west, and Lakes Wojnowskie and Grajewko. Niegocin and Kisajno (comprising Lake Mamry) are connected with two canals. The Łuczkański (Giżycki) Canal, 2.13 km long and 1.9 m deep, dug in 1772 as the first of the eight canals connecting the Great Mazurian Lakes, runs through the very town. The Wilkaski Canal passes the town in the south-west, connecting Lakes Niegocin and Tajty with Lake Mamry. For this reason, a part of Giżycko is, in fact, an island.

Giżycko is the centre of water tourism and iceboating. The extensive water surface and flat banks provide excellent conditions for sailing. The lakes are full of white and multi-coloured sails, yachts, kayaks, water-cycles, and numerous windsurfers. Frequent sailing events and races are organised in the summer, and iceboating competitions in the winter. From here, one can set off to the south through Mikołajki to Ruciane-Nida and to the north to Węgorzewo. There are numerous marinas and fleet ports. Individual tourists and groups can board any of the Mazurian Fleet and privately-owned pleasure cruisers.
